**ROLL TURBAN (Fig. A).**

**MATERIALS** :— 1 oz. CAIRN RIMPLE Wool. Two No. 7 “BEEHIVE” Knitting Needles, measured by Beehive gauge. Piece of wadding.

**TENSION** :— $5\frac{1}{2}$  sts. to inch in width must be obtained. If, using needles recommended, more than  $5\frac{1}{2}$  sts. to inch are obtained, needles a size coarser should be tried; if less than  $5\frac{1}{2}$  sts., then a size finer. **Whatever size of needles found suitable by Knitter, it is absolutely essential that fabric should measure  $5\frac{1}{2}$  sts. to inch.**

**RECIPE** :—Cast on 18 sts.

Work 30 ins. in plain knitting. Cast off. Using a length of wadding, make a roll and lay on inside of knitted strip. Sew up seam over roll, at same time stretching seam to allow full elasticity to fabric. Sew up ends. Twist ends as illustrated, leaving sufficient in centre to fit around head. Sew ends securely.

**SCARF TURBAN (Fig. B).**

**MATERIALS** :— 2 oz. CAIRN RIMPLE Wool—the original was worked with 1 oz. each of Brown and Gold. Two size C Knitting Needles.

**MEASUREMENTS** :—Width,  $3\frac{3}{4}$  ins. Length, when slightly stretched, 40 ins.

**TENSION** :— $3\frac{1}{2}$  sts. to inch in width (not stretched) must be obtained to give a garment of above-mentioned size. If, using needles recommended, more than  $3\frac{1}{2}$  sts. to inch are obtained, needles a size coarser should be tried; if less than  $3\frac{1}{2}$  sts., then a size finer. **Whatever size of needles found suitable by Knitter, it is absolutely essential that fabric should measure  $3\frac{1}{2}$  sts. to inch.**

**RECIPE** :—Using Brown Wool, cast on 13 sts.

**1st row.**—\* K.1, P.1, repeat from \* to last st., K.1.

Repeat this row until work measures 40 ins. when slightly stretched. Cast off. Using Yellow Wool, cast on 13 sts. and work another piece exactly same.

Sew cast-on edge and cast-off edge of one piece together, thus forming a loop.

Thread other piece through loop thus formed and sew cast-on edge to cast-off edge. Arrange round head, as illustrated.

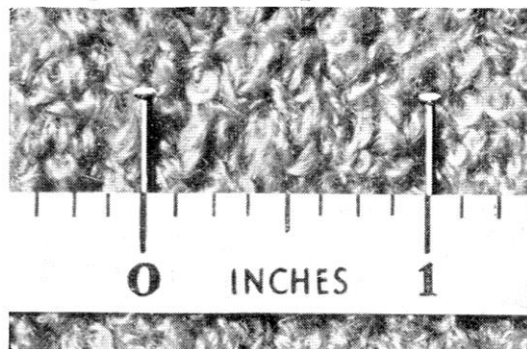
**TURBAN (with crown) (Fig. C).**

**MATERIALS** :— 3 oz. CAIRN RIMPLE Wool. Two No. 7 “BEEHIVE” Knitting Needles, measured by Beehive gauge. A Beehive Stitch-holder. Small quantity of wadding.

**MEASUREMENT** :—Width all round head-piece (when slightly stretched), 22 ins.

**TENSION** :—5 sts. to inch in width (not stretched) must be obtained to give a garment of above-mentioned size. If, using needles recommended, more than 5 sts. to inch are obtained, needles a size coarser should be tried; if less than 5 sts., then a size finer. **Whatever size of needles found suitable by Knitter, it is absolutely essential that fabric should measure 5 sts. to inch.**

**Double Wool must be used and all plain knitted sts. must be worked through back of loops, with exception of trimming band, where sts. of every alternate row are worked through back of loops.**

**ABBREVIATIONS** :— K. = Knit plain; P. = Purl; st. = stitch; tog. = together; t.b.l. = through back of loops.

**RECIPE** :—**THE CROWN.**—Using two balls of wool together, cast on 32 sts.

Work 2 rows in plain knitting.

**3rd row.**—\* K.3, increase once in next

st., repeat from \* to last 4 sts., K.4 (there should now be 39 sts. on needle).

**4th row.**—K.1, purl to last 3 sts., increase once in next st., P.1, K.1.

**5th row.**—K.1, increase once in next st., knit plain to end of row.

Repeat 4th and 5th rows three times, then 4th row once (there should now be 48 sts. on needle).

Leave these sts. on a stitch-holder, until other side has been worked.

Using two balls of wool together, cast on 32 sts.

Work 2 rows in plain knitting.

**3rd row.**—\* K.3, increase once in next st., repeat from \* to last 4 sts., K.4 (there should now be 39 sts. on needle).

**4th row.**—K.1, increase once in next st., purl to last st., K.1.

**5th row.**—Knit plain to last 3 sts., increase once in next st., K.2.

Repeat 4th and 5th rows three times, then 4th row once (there should now be 48 sts. on needle).

In next row knit plain to last st., increase once in last st., knit sts. which were left on to end of same needle.

Continue in plain, smooth fabric without shaping until work measures 3 ins. from commencement, ending with a purl row.

Proceed as follows:—

**1st row.**—\* K.10, K.2 tog.t.b.l., repeat from \* to last st., K.1.

**2nd and alternate rows.**—K.1, purl to last st., K.1.

**3rd row.**—\* K.9, K.2 tog.t.b.l., repeat from \* to last st., K.1.

**5th row.**—\* K.8, K.2 tog.t.b.l., repeat from \* to last st., K.1.

**7th row.**—\* K.7, K.2 tog.t.b.l., repeat from \* to last st., K.1.

**9th row.**—\* K.6, K.2 tog.t.b.l., repeat from \* to last st., K.1.

**11th row.**—\* K.5, K.2 tog.t.b.l., repeat from \* to last st., K.1.

**13th row.**—\* K.4, K.2 tog.t.b.l., repeat from \* to last st., K.1.

**15th row.**—\* K.3, K.2 tog.t.b.l., repeat from \* to last st., K.1.

**17th row.**—\* K.2, K.2 tog.t.b.l., repeat from \* to last st., K.1.

**19th row.**—\* K.1, K.2 tog.t.b.l., repeat from \* to last st., K.1.

**21st row.**—\* K.2 tog.t.b.l., repeat from \* to last st., K.1.

Break off wool, run end through remaining sts., draw up and fasten off securely.

**THE BAND.**—Using two balls of wool together, cast on 18 sts.

**1st row.**—Knit plain.

**2nd row.**—K.6, turn.

**3rd row.**—Knit plain.

**4th row.**—K.12, turn.

**5th row.**—Knit plain.

**6th row.**—Knit plain to end of row.

**7th row.**—K.1, increase once in next st., K.13, K.2 tog.t.b.l., K.1.

**8th row.**—Knit plain.

Repeat 7th and 8th rows until work measures 8 ins. (at long side), ending with 8th row. Proceed as follows:—

**1st row.**—K.1, (K.2 tog.) eight times, K.1.

**2nd row.**—Knit plain.

**3rd row.**—K.1, increase once in next st., K.5, K.2 tog., K.1.

Repeat 2nd and 3rd rows, until work measures 25 ins. (at long side) ending with 2nd row.

Proceed as follows:—

**1st row.**—K.1, (increase once in next st.) eight times, K.1.

**2nd row.**—Knit plain.

**3rd row.**—K.1, increase once in next st., K.13, K.2 tog., K.1.

Repeat 2nd and 3rd rows until work measures 33 ins. (at long side) ending with 2nd row. Proceed as follows:—

**1st row.**—K.12, turn.

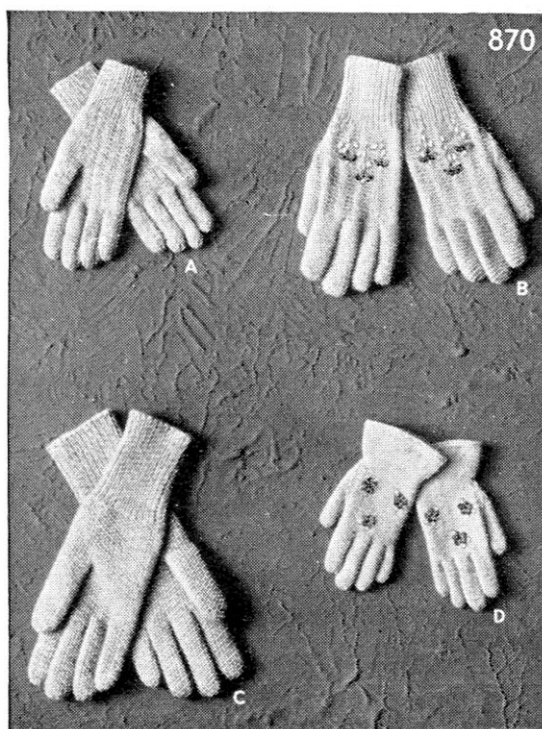
**2nd row.**—Knit plain.

**3rd row.**—K.6, turn.

**4th row.**—Knit plain. Cast off.

**TO MAKE UP.**—With a damp cloth and hot iron press carefully. Sew up back seam by joining corresponding ridges (formed by st. knitted at each end of every row). Sew one edge of band in position (slightly easing it on to hat) to within  $\frac{1}{2}$  in. of peak in front. Pad band at front, from increasings. Sew to form a roll and twist ends to form a knot in front as illustrated.

☞ It is well worth while to devote special attention to this matter of "finish." It can make all the difference to the final result!
